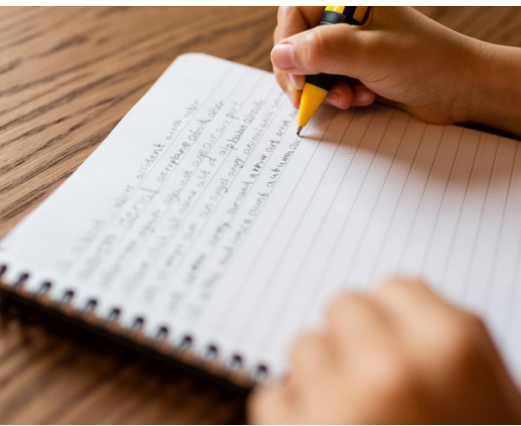


CALIFORNIA QUALIFYING HOUSE 2024 ANNUAL REPORT



The California Qualifying Houses are a series of Short-Term Residential Therapeutic Programs (STRTPs) located in the Sierra Nevada Mountains, offering trauma-informed care in a healing, supportive environment. The program serves female and gender non-conforming youth ages 14–17, as well as non-minor dependents (age 18), referred by California placing agencies.

The California Qualifying Houses focus on stabilizing behaviors, fostering resilience, and delivering individualized therapeutic support to prepare youth for successful transitions into adulthood and reintegration into the community. Residents receive comprehensive therapeutic and academic services, along with a range of evidence-based group interventions, including Aggression Replacement Training (ART), Positive Organizational Culture (POC), Positive Skill Development (PSD), Seeking Safety, and life skills development.

2024 OUTCOMES

- 16 years old was the average age in 2024
- 6 hours of education per day
- 3.8 hours of treatment per week
- 26 average family contacts per month

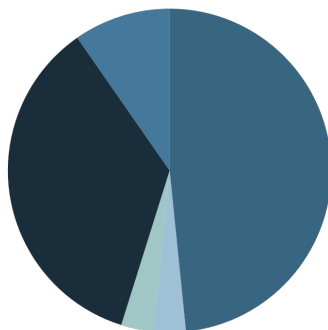
DEMOGRAPHICS OF YOUTH SERVED

Age



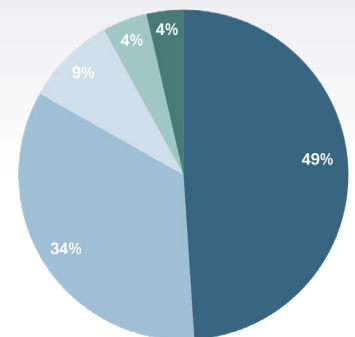
■ 14 ■ 15 ■ 16 ■ 17
